Rules for Appointments

January 5, 2006

At the second meeting of each year, the Executive Director will prepare and the Board will review a list of current Board members and their terms of office.

The term of office of an at-large member of the Board ("Quad Rep") lasts one year¹. The term of office of all other Board members lasts two years². Terms of office begin with the calendar year on January 1^3 .

The Board considers a representative of the City Council to be appointed to the Board when the City Council President notifies the Board.

The Board considers a representative of the Mayor to be appointed to the Board when the Mayor notifies the Board.

Each of the four constituent community associations specified in section 2.03(C) of the Bylaws may select two representatives to serve on the Board: the president of the association (or their designee) and one representative selected by the association.

The Board considers a representative of a constituent community association to be appointed to the Board when their association notifies the Board.

Each of the three constituent business associations specified in section 2.03(D) may select two representatives to serve on the Board.

The Board considers a representative of a constituent business association to be appointed to the Board when their association notifies the Board.

The Board is responsible for appointing members representing neighborhood associations bordering the District⁴, and nonprofit organizations and religious institutions within the District⁵. The Board may rescind such an appointment⁶.

Neighborhood associations bordering the District and nonprofit organizations or religious institutions within the District may propose representatives to be considered for appointment but do not have the authority to appoint their representatives to the Board.
